Program in Detail

Our Venue

The center of our activities will be the Abbey district. This building complex not only housed the monastery but also served as the residence of the prince-abbots in their capacity as secular rulers. We will also visit the old town and have dinner in the hills outside St. Gall

History of the monastery and town of St. Gall

In Roman and early medieval times the area was a wilderness between the Lake of Constance and the Alpstein mountains. Around 612, Gallus, an Irish monk erected a hermitage on the banks the Steinach stream where he lived until about 640 or 650. The hermitage attracted many disciples. In 719, Otmar, one of Saint Gallus' successors founded the abbey, which in 741 adopted the rules of St. Benedict. In its scriptorium, the monks copied books by hand, many of which are still in the abbey library. The abbey was not only a religious and cultural center, but became rich and powerful. The princeabbots controlled large parts of eastern Switzerland and southern Germany as a territorial state and ally of the old Swiss Confederation until 1803, when the abbey's territory was integrated into the newly created canton of St. Gall. In 1805 the abbey was dissolved. Today the abbey buildings house the parliament and the government of the canton of St. Gall, as well as its Cantonal Court. The whole abbey district was declared a UNESCO world heritage site in 1983. Apart from the cathedral and abbey buildings, the site comprises the baroque abbey library and archives with their historic collections.

Gallus and the Bear

According to legend, Gallus was sitting at a fire when a bear threatened to attack him. Gallus admonished the animal and ordered him to fetch wood. The bear obeyed and Gallus gave the bear a loaf of bread. The bear never threatened humans again. The monastery took the legendary bear into its coat of arms (on a golden background).

Outside the monastery a settlement was founded which grew into the town of St. Gall. It also prospered as a trading center and from the production of linen. In later centuries it became a center of the cotton, lace and textile industries. From the 13th century onwards it sought its independence from the abbey.

The relationship between town and monastery was not always easy, in particular after the Reformation, when the abbey was surrounded by the protestant town, which in turn was surrounded by the prince-abbot's territory.

Friday, June 21

Modern art collection of the University of St. Gall

For those of you who will arrive in St. Gall early in the afternoon, we propose a guided visit to the University of St. Gall's (HSG) modern art collection. The HSG possesses a unique art in architecture collection second to no other public university in the world, including works by Hans Arp, Georges Braque, Alexander Calder, Martin Disler, Alberto Giacometti, Joan Miró, Roman Signer, Gerhard Richter and Antoni Tàpies. In planning the campus in the mid-1950's, the university's architect wanted to create an artistic synthesis with the buildings, reflecting the goal to provide a holistic education. The works were financed by donations from companies, foundations and private individuals, as well as by the sale of lithographs, which the artists provided free of charge.

The University is about 10 min by bus from the main railway station (Bus 9 departing from Platform I). We will meet at 16:15 under the large binary clock at the entrance of the railway station.

Dinner at the restaurant National zum Goldenen Leuen («Naz»)

This traditional restaurant - nicknamed "Naz" by the locals – is located in the old town in a typical building dating from 1603 and has been a restaurant since 1861. We will meet there for dinner at 19:30.

Saturday, June 22

2024 IABA Annual Meeting (members only)

At 9:00 IABA members will meet in the parliament chamber ("Kantonsratssaal") of the Canton St. Gall for its annual general meeting. This room was formerly the princeabbot's throne room and is a very special venue.

Academic lecture and historical exposé

The AGM will be followed by a lecture by Prof. Vito Roberto (LLM '91) Director at the Institute for Legal Studies and Legal Practice (IRP)at the University of St. Gall on corporate liability for human rights violations and pollution.

Following the academic lecture we will have a brief talk on the historical aspects of the former throne room and its modern use by the St. Gall parliament.

Program for non-members / accompanying persons

At 11:00 we propose a tour of interesting rooms in the abbey buildings used by the cantonal government. The tour will end in the Parliament Chamber, arriving there around 12:00 for the exposé on its history as a throne room.

Buffet lunch

After the morning program, we will have a buffet lunch in the anti-chamber next to the Parliament Chamber.

Guided visit of the Abbey Library and Archives

After lunch (14:30) we will have a 90-minute guided tour of the Baroque Abbey and the Archive Exhibition.



Abbey Library

The Abbey library is Switzerland's oldest library and is located in a splendid baroque hall. It has its origins in the scriptorium of Otmar and his monks. The library contains the abbey's collection at the time of its dissolution and – together with the archives – is a center of research today.

Since medieval times many legal and other documents were entrusted to Abbey archives for safe-keeping. The most famous document – and heart of the Archive Exhibition – is the St. Gall monastery plan. It is the oldest existing medieval building plan, drawn (or copied from an older document) by monks of Reichenau for the Abbey of St. Gall around 820-830. It depicts the ideal layout for a Benedictine monastery, but was never realized.

The monastery plan and UC Berkeley

UC Berkeley has played a special role in the research on the St. Gall plan. In 1965 the German art historian Wolfgang Braunfels asked Professors Walter Horn (art history) and Ernst Born (architecture) of UC Berkeley, who had made a scale model based on the plan, to establish a compilation of knowledge about the parchment. Their research resulted in the three-volume work, "The Plan of St. Gall", published by the UC University Press in 1979.

the restaurant (10 min). Weather permitting, we will have cocktails outdoors before our official dinner.

Guided Tour

At 10:30 we will meet at the tourist information center just across from the Abbey District for a 90-minute walking tour of the old town. Our guide will take us to many historic houses and will tell the tales of their former inhabitants and their impact on St. Gall history, including the reformation, chocolate manufacture, medicine and other events. The tour will bring the old town to life.

To close our event we will have a farewell lunch in the well-known restaurant Marktplatz, which as its German name suggests, is very close to the market square.

Transportation

Getting to St. Gall

By train

St. Gall is located on the main railway line Geneva - Zurich - Munich

From Zurich and Zurich airport

Direct fast trains run from Zurich main station (HB) via the Zurich airport station (under the terminal) to St. Gall every 30 minutes. (IC1, IC 5 and IR 13. Time from airport 50 - 60 minutes; Time from Zurich main station: 60 - 75 minutes.

By car

St. Gall is located on the Swiss A1 (Europe E 60) from Geneva via Zurich to the Austrian border. There are several car parks around the inner city, mostly underground. <u>https://www.pls-sg.ch</u>

Getting around in St. Gall

St. Gall is fairly compact and its old town and can be discovered on foot. The venues are all within walking distance of our hotels or can be reached by public transport. The restaurant "Schwarzer Bären" which is located outside of town has its own train stop directly in front.

Especially if you are staying longer you may want to consider purchasing an Oskar Guest Card from the participating hotels (minimum 2 nights stay) for CHF 17 per day. The card allows you to travel free on the train network of the cantons St. Gall, Appenzell, Thurgau, Schaffhausen and Glarus, including a number of mountain railways. 




St. Gall overview
